Cent'Anni Baccolo Appassimento Veneto, Italy 	5.40	6.85	19.50
The Renaissance, the 'floating city', Napoleon's victory in 1797... all faded into insignificance as notable in the history of the Veneto region when this wine was created. The grapes are partially dried to increase flavour. Think of it as a light, baby Amarone with less alcohol and less damage to your bank balance!			
Nostros Carmenère Maipo Valley, Chile 	5.50	6.95	19.95
Made by a young and dynamic team, this is intense, almost black, with berries, truffle, paprika and pepper notes. Carmenère was presumed extinct following the phylloxera outbreak in France. Luckily, some was being grown in Chile, having been exported from Bordeaux, although they thought it was Merlot...[wake up]...this is delicious!			
Jaffelin Pinot Noir VdF, France 	5.95	8.35	23.95
Based in the heart of Beaune, Jaffelin are a Burgundy producer with a genius winemaker - Marinette Garnier. This Vin de France is super soft with low tannins and acidity yet has delicious structure and fruit that punches well above its weight thanks to a combination of grapes from Burgundy and the Loire.			
Verne Malbec Mendoza, Argentina 	6.25	8.95	25.95
A deep dense blockbuster from 40+ year old vines. Blackberry plum fruit and sweet spice. Silky, warm, juicy and fruity, it's probably impossible to dislike this – go on, have a few bottles and try.			
The Scoundrel Shiraz / Grenache Barossa Valley, Australia			27.95
Ooh, you cheeky little magpie pinching all those juicy grapes. Wait until Mr Rolf Binder, Barossa legend, catches you. <i>No, don't Rolf, it's just a magpie, what are you... oh the humanity.</i> I'm assured no magpies were harmed in the making of this red fruit and spice laden wine.			
Mirador Reserva 2011 Rioja, Spain			31.50
Just like a Christmas episode of Eastenders, you know exactly what you're getting when you have a bottle of Mirador. Their Reserva is almost unbeatable; spice and dried fruit, it's like your favourite old jumper and there's nothing wrong with that.			
Holden Manz Visionaire 2013 Franschhoek, South Africa 			32.50
A 'fluid' Bordeaux blend (it's got some Syrah in it) that is absolutely belting – spice, red fruits, dark fruits and graphite – this is seriously grown up stuff. <i>Franschhoek</i> always looks misspelt to me.			
Coyam by Emiliana 2015 Colchagua Valley, Chile   			37.50
You're in true Icon territory with this predominantly Syrah and Cabernet Sauvignon blend. Named after the oak forests that surround Emiliana's Los Robles home, it is a triumph of winemaking and, to borrow from the great mind of W. Pooh, worth every <i>pound, shilling and ounce</i> .			
Château Teyssier 2012 Bordeaux, France			37.50
Jonathon Maltus was the first English winemaker to win a perfect Robert Parker score. This Merlot and Cabernet Franc blend is deep red, powerful and complex with cherries, red fruit and a touch of wood.			
Vina Robles Petite Sirah 2014 California, USA			55.00
Hailing from the Los Robles area of California, hence the original name, the block from which this wine comes is elevated and has very shallow, chalky soils... yawn. Dark, spice, chocolate, supple and chewy – that's all you need to know.

Lunetta Prosecco Spumante White or Rosé 20cl NV Veneto, Italy			7.00
Need a little pick-me-up or perhaps the other half won't share a whole bottle with you. I'd order half a dozen and show them you're not to be messed with.			
Passaparola Prosecco Spumante NV Veneto, Italy 			23.00
To the tune of Escape (The Piña Colada song) by Rupert Holmes. <i>If you like Pass-a-parola Having fizz in the sun Gentle apple and peach flavours Should be enough just for one...</i>			
Vilarnau Brut Reserve NV Peñedes, Spain			24.95
Good Lord, don't let the packaging put you off. Cava is a great region and its wines are so unfashionable it means many a bargain can be had. Made in the same way as Champagne, it has lovely balance and autolytic (bread, nut, butter, brioche etc.) notes.			
Jaffelin Crémant de Bourgogne Blanc de Blancs NV Burgundy, France 			26.95
Another belter from the hands of Jaffelin's Marinette (see the Pinot Noir). Almost entirely Chardonnay 15 months ageing so it's got nice buttery brioche notes as well as freshness. Great with lighter dishes – it's the <i>in the know</i> choice. People who know, particularly that you know, know you know when they know you've ordered this.			
Autréau Premier Cru Brut NV Champagne, France			45.00
Ooh la la, Premier Cru sounds rather flash doesn't it? This is a lovely and soft fizz from excellent vineyards and has some nice fruit thanks to it being mainly Pinots Noir and Meunier.			
Joseph Perrier Cuvée Royale Brut NV Champagne, France 	8.50		49.50
The Grande Marque Champagne house you've never heard of? Keep your LP in the cupboard, take the VC back to the shop, JP is the one you want. Finesse, style and sophistication by the bottle-full. Supplied to Queen Victoria and Edward VII, so Cuvée Royale - geddit?			
Ruinart Blanc de Blancs Brut NV Champagne, France			98.50
100% Chardonnay predominantly from the Côte des Blancs in Champagne (i.e. the best part of Champagne to grow Chardonnay – the soil is very chalky, just like Wiston's vineyard in West Sussex!). This is elegant and quite intense. Top notch Grande Marque from one of the oldest names in Champagne.
