▼ Réserve Saint-Marc Cabernet Sauvignon VdP d’Oc, France	3.50	5.50	6.95	19.95
Did you know that Cabernet Sauvignon was the result of natural cross between Cabernet Franc and Sauvignon Blanc? Fascinating stuff, this wine nonsense. Saint-Marc has cast his saintly magic again and conjured up a smooth blackcurrant gem.				
▼ Cent’Anni Baccolo Appassimento Veneto, Italy	4.00	6.00	7.95	22.95
The Renaissance, the ‘floating city’, Napoleon’s victory in 1797... all faded into insignificance as notable in the history of the Veneto region when this wine was created. The grapes are partially dried to increase flavour. Think of it as a light, baby Amarone with less alcohol and less damage to your bank balance!				
▼ Percheron Old Vine Cinsault Western Cape, South Africa	4.25	6.25	8.25	23.95
Have a guess at how old these vines are. Go on, bet you don’t come close. They’re 40 years old. Ok, so that might not seem old (depending which side of 40 you sit) but these are unirrigated bush vines, and all of the grapes are picked by hand. Fresh, fruity and utterly irresistible.				
▼ Jaffelin Pinot Noir VdF, France	4.75	6.65	8.75	25.95
Based in the heart of Beaune, Jaffelin are a Burgundy producer with a genius winemaker - Marinette Garnier. This Vin de France is super soft with low tannins and acidity yet has delicious structure and fruit that punches well above its weight thanks to a combination of grapes from Burgundy and the Loire.				
▼ Verne Malbec Mendoza, Argentina	5.00	7.25	9.75	28.50
A deep dense blockbuster from 40+ year old vines. Blackberry plum fruit and sweet spice. Silky, warm, juicy and fruity, it’s probably impossible to dislike this – go on, have a few bottles and try.				
Portal D’ouro Tinto Douro, Portugal	5.25	7.50	9.95	28.95
This red is the equivalent of pulling on that old pair of comfortable jeans. You know, the ones that you just can’t part with. It’s all about comfort, instantaneous satisfaction and relief. This Portal is pretty full bodied, and bursts with red fruit and some toasty notes. A guaranteed “mmmm” on the first sip.				
▼ Ontañón Vino Ecológico Organic Rioja Rioja, Spain	5.95	7.95	11.25	32.50
Bodegas Ontañón love three things: Rioja, sustainability and diacritic marks. This organic number is testament to the family’s commitment to the environment and is delicious to boot. No dolphins were harmed in the making of this wine.				
Château Grand Peyrou St Émilion Grand Cru Bordeaux, France				45.95
To qualify as Grand Cru, a Saint Emilion must pass a tasting panel test to make sure it is worthy of the description – I’m pretty sure Simon Cowell owns 51% of the rights to this process and is intending to broadcast it from 2025. The vines on this small, 2-hectare plot are an average of 40 years old, which brings a real intensity and maturity to the wine.				
Mercurey Rouge Domaine Meunier Burgundy, France				47.95
Symbol Hg. Atomic number 80. Boiling point 356.7 °C. No, not that one, but a village in the Côte Chalonnaise region of Burgundy. This effort, from Gaëlle and Jérôme Meunier, is beautifully pure with bright, fresh red fruits and subtle baking spice notes. Great concentration.

Il Caggio Prosecco Spumante NV Venezie, Italy	5.95			27.95
Amongst other things, the Romans used to love a bit of still Prosecco. Made from the same grapes, and in the same area, it is known as Prosecco Tranquillo. It is still available today but please don’t ask us to get it for you. This one is very much of the fizzy and fresh style.				
▼ Jaffelin Crémant de Bourgogne Blanc de Blancs NV Burgundy, France				45.95
Another belter from the hands of Jaffelin’s Marinette (see the Pinot Noir). Almost entirely Chardonnay 15 months ageing so it’s got nice buttery brioche notes as well as freshness.				
▼ Joseph Perrier Cuvée Royale Brut NV Champagne, France	10.50			59.95
The Grande Marque Champagne house you’ve never heard of? Keep your LP in the cupboard, take the VC back to the shop, JP is the one you want. Finesse, style and sophistication by the bottle-full. Supplied to Queen Victoria and Edward VII, so Cuvée Royale - geddit?				
▼ Joseph Perrier Cuvée Royale Vintage 2008 Champagne, France				89.95
This is the equivalent to bringing out a pyramid of Ferrero Rocher at the end of a dinner party. JP ‘s vintage is from the stunning 2008 vintage; widely lauded as one of the best in recent memory. Mr. Ambassador (or whoever is paying the bill) you are spoiling us.
