Cal Y Canto Verdejo | Tierra de Castilla, Spain 3.50 5.50 6.95 19.95
Nothing to do with the infamous Cali Cartel – that’s spelled differently and I’m pretty sure the winery isn’t a front for cocaine trafficking – but everything to do with juicy, fresh, delicate flavours.

▼ **Patterson’s Select Reserve Chardonnay | SA, Australia** 3.95 5.95 7.65 21.95
I don’t know who this Patterson person is but their Chardonnay is, as the locals might say, a little ripper. Cast from your mind memories of ‘ABC’ (anything but Chardonnay for the youngsters) and oak-filled teabags bobbing about in vats of white wine. This is fresher, crispier and zippier than Aussie wines by the glass of yesteryear; it’s the perfect foundation for a grape that might become a lifelong love.

▼ **Percheron Chenin Blanc Viognier | Western Cape, South Africa** 4.00 6.00 7.95 22.95
Vibrant? Check. Aromatic? Check. Lime rich Karoo soils? Check (I think). 30+ year old Chenin Blanc combines beautifully with 15+ year old Viognier to create a gloriously bright and flavoursome wine. There’s a horse on the label too.

▼ **Picpoul de Pinet Prestige Foncalieu | VdP d’Oc, France** 4.50 6.75 8.50 24.50
How long can a variety remain trendy? Is trendiness a paradox with time? Does it matter when it’s this fresh, balanced and a match made in heaven for seafood? Fetch me a bottle of your finest Pickers!

Mayfly Sauvignon Blanc | Marlborough, New Zealand 4.95 7.00 9.50 26.95
A propensity for naming their Sauvignon after animals has been well documented in New Zealand and they’ve conjured up another spurious connection with this wine. Luckily, whilst the marketing department have taken an early lunch, the winemaking team didn’t. Great zippy fruit with asparagus notes and a delicious finish.

Luzada Albariño | Rías Baixas, Spain 5.50 7.75 10.25 29.95
If you’ve never seen the vines in Rías Baixas then you’re missing out on a viticultural treat. The cool sea air means that damp is a real issue for winemakers so they trellis the vines up high and spread them out overhead to maximise air flow and sun exposure. This cool air isn’t all bad – the wines are fantastically mineral driven and fresh.

▼ **Gavi del Comune di Gavi Nuovo Quadro | Piemonte, Italy** 5.75 7.95 10.50 30.50
Cortese, the grape and not some underworld Colombian don in hiding, is the star grape here. This is top-notch single estate Gavi that is hand-harvested and spends six months ageing on its lees. White peach and pear with hints of lime and balanced by lovely acidity.

Chablis Domaine Fournillon | Burgundy, France 35.95
I've always loved the fact that Chablis is a puritanical outpost of Burgundy for white wine. You'll find it roughly halfway between the Cote d'Or and Paris - it's closer to Champagne than it is Burgundy. It should always be mineral focussed, refreshing and have a rapier like acidity. Nowhere else in the world can do this with Chardonnay.

Pouilly-Fumé Domaine Lebrun | Loire, France 42.95
There’s nothing wrong with a wine list cliché as long as it’s as good as Lebrun’s PF. Herbaceous, lime-driven and a nice bit of grassiness about it. Sauvignon Blanc is a thing of beauty when it ends up like this.

ROSÉ

▼ **Cielo Pinot Grigio Blush | Venezie, Italy** 3.85 5.75 7.25 21.00
Pinot Grigio is always white? Guess again PG novice; Pinot Grigio grapes often have red/purple skin which lends it perfectly to the production of rose wine. Why they need to use a name that conjures up images of dark sweet blush from the 1980s though is beyond me. This is light and fresh – perfect sunshine fodder.

Chemin de Provence Rosé | Provence, France 5.50 7.75 10.25 29.95
Chemin means path in French so I suppose this can be viewed as the gateway wine to Provence’s charms. Like all controlled gateway substances, one sip of this will transport you to a magical land of sunflowers, fields of lavender and glorious sunshine. Hopefully...

▼ **Whispering Angel | Provence, France** 41.95
Whispering Angel is at the top of the Provence pyramid and the musings on the back label alone are worth the purchase (what on Earth are they talking about?). Luckily, when you strip back the marketing it’s a truly delicious wine that deserves its cult following.
